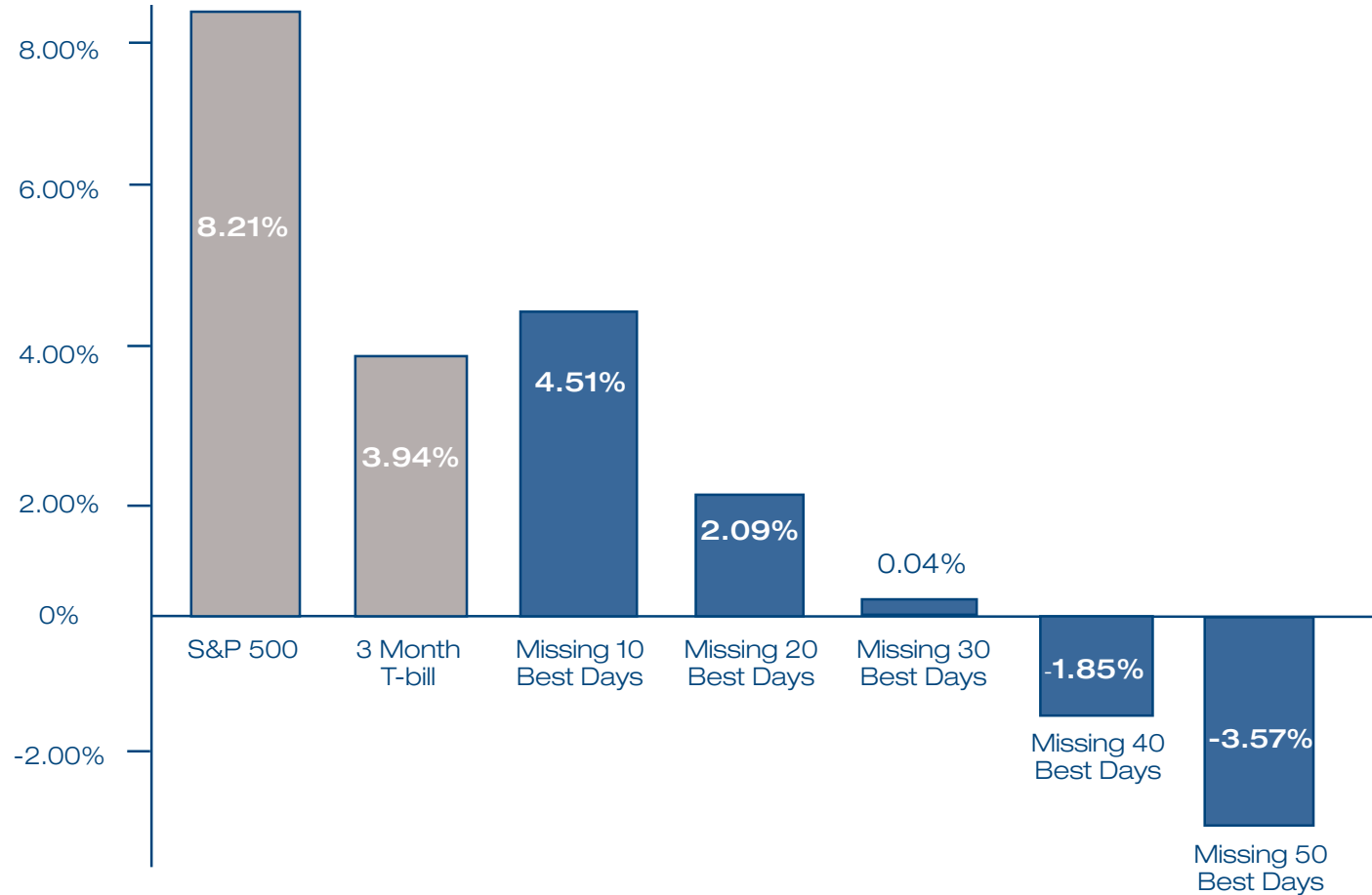


Impact of Missing the Market - S&P 500 Average Annual Total Returns (1989-2009)
